We watch this blood-soaked electoral contest as the "liberal" party rushes to claim the crown of genocider-in-chief, deporter-in-chief, privatizer-in-chief, while her administration sends Israel 65% of its bombs and runs diplomatic cover to launder its crimes, while Democrats in our state beg the right-wing Supreme Court to brutalize homeless people and students, while their whole recruitment strategy is to tell us Amy Klobuchar said Dick Cheney said Kamala is Brat.

And there is blood on our hands, too. It's our tax dollars that fund Israel's bombs, our politicians who sign off on mass slaughter, our bosses who invest in arms, our landlords who buy illegal settlements, our media which excuses atrocities. We live in this hell because of our collective failure to make it otherwise—by showing up every few years to choose

a lesser evil, lesser by degrees that require a larger and larger microscope.

But in our complicity there is leverage: We can organize at work and at home and at school, in our city and our cultural spheres to boycott, divest, and sanction. We have leverage in every single axis of our lives. The majority

of Americans want an arms embargo—and healthcare and housing—but we need to build the infrastructures of countervailing power to enforce our popular will.

This year we have also watched an occupied people resist, unhoused people fight back, and they need not our sympathy but our sacrifice—of our time, our energy, someone else's approval—to act in solidarity such that another reality is possible. We owe it to the universes of martyrs and those

surviving and to each other to take responsibility for what we do everyday to remake the world. **HAPPY VOTING!**

Prop 2: YES

We are still clawing out of the fallout of California's property tax revolt. Prop 13, passed in 1978, more than halved California's budget, lavished permanent benefits

on the state's wealthiest homeowners, and decimated

its welfare, infrastructure, and public school spending.

Now, to pay for repairs of its public schools-where almost

40% of students are stuck in substandard conditions

and 15% in hazardous conditions-California will borrow \$10 billion from rich people, and have to pay \$16 billion back. What are you gonna do, say no?



Prop 3: YES

Marriage is an economic contract that allows people within the dyadic couple form to access state subsidies and pass on their assets. But the state should let gays do it, too. (Anyone remember "NOH8"?)



Prop 4: YES

To pay for water, fire & wildlife protection, California will borrow \$10 billion from rich people, and have to pay \$16 billion back. What are you gonna do, say no?

Prop 5: YES

This prop will drop the threshold for approval for local government bonds from 2/3 of voters to 55%. Pruning the limbs of 70s counter-insurgency one branch at a time, that 2/3rds rule is another artifact of the tax revolt of Prop 13: they imposed austerity and called it democracy. With Prop 5, the Realtors Association won a bullshit carve

out to protect their precious single family homes, and the state will proceed to subsidize developers and private corporations, but we should lower the hurdle for government projects from a de-facto veto.

STATE BALLOT MEASURES

Prop 6: YES

Some 60,000 of the 90,000 people trapped in prisons (not including jails) in California are paid in cents per hour to clean, serve, cook, sew, slaughter cattle, machine license plates, pick almonds, even (for a little extra) fight wildfires, and they are routinely beaten, denied parole, showers, calls, food, or thrown into solitary if they refuse this work. America's public prisons have been forcing incarcerated people to work for private companies and other public agencies since 1979now an \$11 billion dollar industry nationwide. This is forced labor, in other words, involuntary servitude, in other words, slavery. Even Alabama has outlawed it, but Suited Slenderman Governor Newsom fought to preserve it in our state. No incar-

cerated person will be safe from forced labor so long as they are

incarcerated, but we should give them a defense on the books.

Prop 32: YES

Raise the goddamn minimum wage! At \$18/hour, you'd still have to put half your wages towards the average apartment.

STATE BALLOT MEASURES

Prop 33: DEAR GOD YES

Props to the landlord lobby for spending \$112+ million on a campaign of lies, which has confused even my own friends. Prop 33 legalizes expansions of rent control by repealing a 1995 State law, Costa-Hawkins, which 1) Froze rent control laws at 1995 OR the year when rent control was passed in your city. In LA, this was 1978. In SF, it was 1979. 2) Exempted single family homes. In a single unit building or one built anytime after that year, your landlord can raise your rent whenever and however much he likes, also known as "whatever the market will bear" Rent control stops landlords from ruining people's lives. Rent control stops tenants from losing their homes and ending up without one. Rent

control is collective bargaining at the city scale. This law

doesn't even give it to us it just makes it legal, finally, to try.

Prop 34: NO

This measure is worded to limit the spending activities


of one single organization: the Aids Healthcare Foundation.

Why? Because, again, props to the landlord lobby, they invent-

ed a ballot measure to prevent the one organization running rent control ballot measures from ever doing it again. Is the AHF a fucked up organization? Yes. For this, I will embrace the contradictions.

Prop 35: NO

I do not trust enormous healthcare companies to regulate the payments to enormous healthcare companies.



STATE BALLOT MEASURES

Prop 36: FUCK NO

We should not revive the racist class warfare of the War on

Drugs. We should not make it a felony to possess illicit drugs.

We should not have mandatory minimum sentences for pet-

ty retail theft. We should not bring back three strikes laws to cage people for the primes of their lives. We should not make mass incarceration even more massive. Poverty, addiction, and homelessness are crimes of our capitalist system, not individuals. Already, about 1 in every 49 Black adults and 1 out of every 204 adults in California is trapped in a cage, at the public cost of \$132,860 per person per year. Free them all. Until then, we should give the state absolutely no more reasons to lock people up.



LA COUNTY MEASURES

Measure A: YES

A .05% sales tax (50 cents for every \$100) will generate \$1.1 billion a year for LA county's programs for unhoused people. We could literally take the money from LA's 53 billionaires, who have a combined wealth of \$222 billion, and most of those programs suck, but some of that is keeping people housed right now. We need to build the power to change the policy paradigm. Until then, we can't throw people housed by these programs outdoors.

Measure E: YES

Taxing property owners for fire services that protect

property. Fine.





LA COUNTY MEASURES



Measure G: NO

In 1850 when the population of LA was 9,000, we had 5 county supervisors. In 2024, when the population of LA is 10 million people, we have 5 county supervisors. Measure G would update that from 5 to... 9 whole people? Seems fine/ pathetic. BUT the measure would also create a County Executive which is basically a County Mayor with no term limits and veto powers over policy. We do not need another fame-hungry figurehead who real estate developers can bribe.



Amendment DD: YES

Kevin de Leon: "put [it] in the blender and chop [it] up." Nury Martinez: "slice and dice the baby." Ron Herrera: "I get what we have to do, just create districts that benefit you all." When three City Council members and the Labor Fed Chair were <u>caught</u> on tape trading epithets and slurs, the scandal went deeper than vibes-based racism: it was racism as class war, a gerrymandering scheme to break up the power of tenants. "It serves us not to give [opposing councilwoman] all of K-Town," Martinez said, "because that solidifies her renters' district, and that is not a good thing for any of us." The political process is always rigged against the propertyless, whether or not Council draws its own districts. But at least

we can take that power away.

Amendment ER: YES

Makes the stick a little bigger for politicians who violate " ethics rules" and makes the stick a little closer to reach.

Amendment FF: NO

Do you want to pay public money so cops can have cushier pension plans?

Amendment HH: YES

This amendment gives the City Controller the ability to shine a light into the shadow state-those unaccountable, non-profit subcontractors which the city sloughs off responsibility and resources to, and which make up the <u>Homeless Industrial Complex</u>. (Just because it's a nonprofit doesn't make it good-and doesn't mean people aren't making bank.) See, for example, Urban Alchemy, the "wolves in sheeps

clothing" scam of "outreach workers" who alchemize public funds as mercenaries and jailers of people who live outside. As one worker himself admitted, "the cops rarely fuck with us, because we do all their work." During one winter sweep, another doused an unhoused person with a hose.

knocked fucking doors. But no. They refused because they


wanted to preserve their ballot line. I'm sorry, Jill, I would like my
